




HYGEA

Hygea is a new concept of smart toilet... its natural evolution. The electronic bidet module, that can be installed or replaced very easily like a cartridge, is inserted into the toilet bowl from above and is completely disconnected from its casing and from the seat.

The "Sottosquadro" Curve

The NUR collection represents the pinnacle of Italian engineering and sanitary design, with the edges of the Nur washbasin requiring a reinterpretation of the classic casting process to accommodate the "Sottosquadro" curve.

Craftsmen are required to gradually remove the plaster molds by hand to allow for a multi-stage drying process. The negative inclination of the edge is unique and represents the renewed ambitious attitude of Alice together with the designer Massimiliano Braconi.









To transform this coastal home into a Balinese sanctuary, aligning with our client's vision of a tranquil oasis. They craved the serenity and natural charm of Bali, yearning for a soothing home. The existing layout was kept, but revamped it to maximise functionality and aesthetics.

Embracing earthy tones, textures, natural materials, and a calming colour palette, seamlessly blending indoor and outdoor spaces.
Sustainability was also priority on this project. Replacing harmful materials with eco-friendly alternatives like natural stone, timber, and linen, creating a serene urban retreat.

Despite pandemic-related challenges, the designer collaborated with local suppliers, adapting to the new normal. Design highlights include locally carved panels, metal mesh replacing rattan, oak timber flooring, and honed stone surfaces with edge-lit shelving. Grasscloth wallcoverings, wooden battens, and rattan-inspired paper added character.

The property boasts intricate details from illuminated concrete steps to a cedar exterior with unique batten arrangements. The interiors grasscloth wallpaper, stone tiles, and timber by the pool create an atmosphere of calm and elegance, a true Balinese oasis in the heart of the city.

In summary, this project merged Balinese style with modern sustainability, creating a property that's functional, beautiful, and eco-conscious. It's a place where you can escape the city's hustle, immersing yourself in the peaceful ambiance of a Balinese retreat.

What finish would you choose for your own home?


I would choose Brushed Brass, love the gold finish.
